

Reconsideration of Hiawatha Public Library Materials

This policy functions as a procedure to be used by individuals or groups seeking a reconsideration of library materials held in the Hiawatha Public Library collection.

Library patrons may request books or other materials to be added to the collection. The Hiawatha Public Library Board of Trustees supports intellectual freedom and subscribes to the principles of the <u>American Library Association Library Bill of Rights</u>. The library staff applies the criteria described in the Library Bill of Rights and the Library's Collection Development Policy to provide books and materials that reflect the diversity of viewpoints within the community.

The board recognizes that individuals may question library materials that do not support their tastes and views. Library staff are available to discuss concerns and identify options and alternate materials. If concerns are not satisfied through a discussion with staff, patrons may request a formal reconsideration of library materials. Requests for reconsideration are first handled by the library's Circulation Manager or the Youth Services Librarian, then the Library Director, and ultimately, the library's Board of Trustees.

The board has adopted a process for the formal reconsideration of library materials. This process ensures that questions about specific items in the collection are handled in a prompt and consistent manner.

The material in question will remain in the collection and available to patrons during the reconsideration process. Items the board deems appropriate for the collection will not be removed except by court order.
